  )     INCORPORATING REPRIMAND

This Consent Agreement is entered into between the State of Maine, Board of Registration in Medicine, James F. Jackson, and the Department of the Attorney General pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. §§ 3270-C and 3282-A. James F. Jackson was licensed as a physician assistant in the State of Maine from at least November, 1991, to March, 1993. On March 6, 1992, Mr. Jackson was disciplined by Penobscot Valley Hospital for asking female patients to go out with him on dates. On July 14, 1992, the Board considered the action of Penobscot Valley Hospital and voted to proceed to an adjudicatory hearing on the basis of the issues raised in the Hospital's action.

In lieu of proceeding to an adjudicatory hearing, Mr. Jackson agrees that he shall accept a reprimand for indiscretion in performance of duty. The Board agrees that the existence of the reprimand will not be considered negatively if, after three years from the date of this agreement, Mr. Jackson should reapply for a license as a physician assistant in the State of Maine, so long as, at the time of the application, no additional complaint has been filed or discipline imposed against him alleging unprofessional conduct.

Mr. Jackson has had the opportunity to seek advice of counsel with respect to the negotiation of this Consent Agreement.
